A comprehensive Environmental Impact Statement is required for a project of this scope and size that may have significant impacts on the human environment and on resources such as recreation, Roadless Areas, and Wildlife. Please analyze this.

Also, as a healthcare provider, I experience many, many of my patients suffering moderate to severe health issues when prescribed burns occur. Please evaluate these possible health repercussions.

The Analysis must be site-specific. The condition-based approach is too general and vague to make meaningful scoping comments.
